These trees are well-known for their unique fan-shaped leaves that turn an iconic golden color in the fall. The Ginkgo tree has lasted so long because it is exceptionally hardy and resistant to insects and diseases - traits we admire in it today. Although this tree grows slowly, it makes a great shade tree once mature. The 'Autumn Gold' cultivar is a male clone and does not produce fruit.

Pagoda Dogwood

This spreading small tree has an interesting form, with horizontal branches forming tiers. Branches are nearly parallel to the ground, giving the plant an attractive textural effect. Pagoda dogwood offers extremely fragrant, yellowish white flowers in May to early June, and attractive, bluish black fruit in July or August.

Height: 15-20 feet

Growth Rate: Slow

Water Needs: Watered weekly when there is no rain.

Skyline Honeylocust

Skyline Honeylocust is a tough, medium-sized flowering tree that casts a light shade that won't kill lawn grasses. It typically grows 60–80 feet tall with a rounded spreading crown. Inconspicuous, greenish yellow to greenish white flowers appear in racemes in late spring.

Height: 30-70 feet

Growth Rate: Moderate to Fast

Water Needs: Moderate

Swiss Stone Pine

Pine Swiss is an open and pyramidal evergreen tree while young, but turns to a round-topped and irregular tree when old. Swiss Stone Pine trees are easily grown in average, medium moisture, well-drained soils in full sun. Tolerates a wide range of soils, but prefers sandy loams.

Height: 12-20 feet

Width: 10-15 feet

Growth Rate: Slow

Water Needs: Moderate. Water once a week during hottest months of the year.
